











# RMS Banner™ G4 (Honeycomb)





[“MATRIX”] RMS™ stands for “Rouse Matrix Systems™”. RMS™ expandable grid frameworks are often referred to as “Matrix” for short.

<p><b>1</b></p> <p><b>PREPARE MATRIX</b></p>	<p>RMS G4 Banner Panels come with a non-toxic, sticky, wax coating to help hold balloons in place.</p>	 <p>Lay out Banner Panels in front of you with the  cut out in the upper, left hand corner.</p>	<p>Join Banner Panels one above the other.</p> 	<p>Or, connect Banner Panels side to side.</p> 
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


[“PANELS”] Single sections of RMS™ frameworks are “Matrix Panels”. When filled with balloons they are often called “Balloon Panels”.

 <p>Cut off or pull off the Carrier Tabs.</p>	<p>Wrap Tabs to join Banner Panels.</p> 	<p>Stretch Matrix straight UP.</p> 	<p>If some openings stay closed then:</p> <p>Bend up &amp; down on both sides</p> 	<p>Pull apart.</p> 
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[“HONEYCOMB or HONEY”] refers to the hexagon grid pattern of many RMS™ frameworks. They mimic the honeycomb pattern of bee hives”.





<p><b>2</b></p> <p><b>PREPARE BALLOONS</b></p>	<p>Inflate &amp; squeeze balloons</p> 	<p>Size balloons 4” diameter</p> 	<p>Tie balloons in very tight pairs.</p> <p>Balloons may be loaded in singles, but</p> 	<p>Trim excess balloon necks or tie them in an additional very loose knot.</p> 
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TIP: The best balloon inflation size can vary depending on softness and slickness of balloons. Test for best results.

<p><b>3</b></p> <p><b>LOAD BALLOONS</b></p>	<p>Roll balloons into place with the dark spot on the tops of the balloons pressed against the Matrix and the necks of both balloons pressed against the strap between the balloons.</p>			<p>Equal portions of each balloon should be above and below the Matrix straps.</p> 
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TIP: Use RMS™ Honeycomb Graph Paper to lay out your designs and build scale models to test your ideas.

TIP: Load the Matrix on a firm, flat surface.

 <p><b>ORIENTATION #1</b></p> <p>Open Matrix on grey table Matrix hanging off table</p>	 <p><b>ORIENTATION #1</b></p> <p>Load balloons in pairs Then slide Matrix forward</p>	 <p><b>ORIENTATION #2</b></p> <p>Open Matrix on grey table Matrix hanging off table</p>	 <p><b>ORIENTATION #2</b></p> <p>Load balloons in rows Then slide Matrix forward</p>
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TIP: It is usually helpful to clamp or otherwise attach the Matrix framework to the table while you load balloons.

TIP: You may orient your Matrix for loading as shown in “ORIENTATION #1” or “ORIENTATION #2” above. Just be sure to match the orientation of your graph paper plan to the orientation of your Matrix before you load.
